What's it all about?

This amazing topic will transport the children around the world learning about what deserts are, where they are found and how they came to be.







Scientists: This half term we will be exploring light.

Readers: Using Destination Reader, we will continue being super readers by revisiting the different aspects of reading: questioning, clarifying, inferring, predicting, evaluating, summarising and making connections.

Spellers: Our spelling patterns for this half term will include learning: the suffix ly, ure, tion

Writers: We will be reading Iron Man by Ted Hughes. Using this book, we will write diary entries, news reports and poems.

Mathematicians: The maths topics this half-term are: statistics, length and perimeter and fractions.

Geographers: We will be studying deserts, looking at how they are formed, where they are in the world and who lives in them.

PE: In PE we are going to be developing our communication skills further by participating in a variety of team work activities. Our physical focus will be linking movements together to form routines.

DT: We will be designing and making our own pop up books using different types of levers.

Musicians: We will be learning about folk songs, particularly sea shanties.

RE: We will learn about how new life is celebrated by Humanists (non-religious groups)

Life Skills: In Life Skills this half-term, we will explore our rights and responsibilities, focusing on money.

French: We will finish our learning on numbers and colours, before moving on to transport

Computing: We will be learning about branching databases and simulations

Family Learning Ideas: Explore David Attenborough documentaries on deserts; research animals that live in the deserts and how they are adapted to live there; create art with sand for texture
